After the grand success of first edition of Rain International Nature Film Festival, held last year in Munnar, we are back with its second edition on January 24, 25 and 26, 2020, in Kumarakom.

Situated on the shores of the the longest lake in India, Vembanad, its land braided by intertwined backwaters, Kumarakom is home to a rich variety of flora and fauna in addition to being a retreat for several species of rare migratory birds.

Keeping in mind the unique location of this venue with its distinctive geographical and ecological features, we have designed this edition of the RINFF as a floating film festival. Films will be screened on house boats as they ply the tranquil waters. Foreign guests and celebrities will mingle with participating student filmmakers, delegates from across the state and country, and the local people – the farmers and villagers of Kumarakom. Thus the festival as we envisage it will combine elements as diverse as Nature, Cinema and Tourism, all three in a single event. Our slogan for this edition of the festival reflects this spirit: Let lagoons purify as birds rejoice.

I am truly grateful for the support of the people of Kumarakom and the representatives of its local governing bodies who have made it possible to conduct the festival here.

Organized by Birds Club International and the Jayaraj Foundation, this film festival aims to bring together ecologically aware filmmakers from around the world in order to showcase their works, facilitating an authentic platform for raising environmental awareness. The festival, as usual, will showcase feature films, short films and documentaries from across the globe with the central theme of nature. There is a competition in each category, and the winners will be announced and awarded at the closing ceremony

on January 26. This year too, we have a competition for student films from schools and colleges all over Kerala. It is one of the festival's core missions to engage with the younger generation and to ensure their participation, thereby encouraging them to take up the responsibility of nature conservation, and to spread awareness to the rest of society. This is vital today in these times of rapid environmental degradation primarily at the hands of self-centered and exploitative human beings.

The Prakriti Puraskar lifetime achievement award for nature conservation this year will be conferred upon Saalumarada Thimmakka, India's oldest living environmentalist and recipient of the 2019 Padma Shri award. We have two additional sections this time – a country focus on China and a retrospective featuring the work of one of India's leading wildlife filmmakers, Subbiah Nallamuthu. In addition to film screenings, there will be interaction sessions and discussions on various environmental topics related to the film medium.

Other programmes include a visit to the Kumarakom Bird Sanctuary to observe closely its rich variety of bird species, local and migratory, a unique opportunity to view the red water lilies in full bloom, glimpses into the traditional performing arts of Kerala, and cruises through the backwaters in houseboats combined with film screenings.

I hope you will enjoy this festival and that the experience stays with you for a long time to come. And if after this festival you find that you have become a little more conscious of the world we live in and our place in it than before, I will consider it a great success.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

SAALUMARADA THIMMAKKA

Karnataka's Saalumarada Thimmakka is the oldest living environmentalist in Karnataka. She is a recipient of many awards other than her latest honour, Padma Shri, which she received in 2019.

Born to a family without means, she could not go to school, so Thimmakka started working as a laborer at the age of 10. She was later married to Bekal Chikkayya, who too hailed from a modest background. When she was unable to give birth to a child, Thimmakka and her husband decided to plant trees and care for them like their children. Thimmakka's husband died in the year 1991 but she continued the mission they began together. She planted around 385 banyan trees between Hulikal and Kudur in Magadi Taluk of Ramnagar district. She has given more than 70 years of her life to planting trees and has reportedly planted over 8,000 trees in these years.

Thimmakka proves that age is no deterrent to help the environment. The term of endearment used for her — Saalumarada — means rows of trees in Kannada.She is a recipient of over 50 awards for her contributions to the environment including the National Citizens Award (1996) and the Godfrey Phillips Award (2006).

We, the organisers of Rain International Nature Film Festival are proud to have Saalumarada Thimmakka as the recipient of the Prakrithi Puraskar this year, the lifetime achievement award to honour exceptional work in environmental conservation.

Even though Krishna loses one of her young cubs while shifting them to a safer den, she raises the remaining three cubs-two daughters and one son with instinctive maternal care. But her troubles are far from over as the greatest danger comes from within! Krishna's dominant daughter Lightning bullies and heckles her weaker sister Arrowhead. Its a tightrope act for Krishna- she must keep her dominant daughter in check, protect her family and train them to become ace hunters. Incredibly, and perhaps because of Krishna's training, her weaker daughter learns to stand her ground against her strong sister. In her guest for independence and power, the daughter Arrowhead leaves her family, relocating to a territory at the edge of her mother's kingdom. Shot over a period of two and half years, Clash of Tigers, an observational documentaries drama, captures extraordinary behavior in a powerful story of tiger family.




Life Force 2: The Western Ghats

The Western Ghat is a moist tropical oasis thrust up above the arid Indian sub continent by an ancient super volcano. Over millions of years, this strip of stepped coastal highlands has become a refuge for unique collection of creatures, many of which cannot be seen anywhere else on earth like the slow moving Slender Loris, Lion Tailed Macaque, the strange looking Horn bill; and the living fossil- the purple frog, along with multiple species cats; the Asiatic lion of Gir, Tigers and Leopards. Considered Western Ghats has unexceptionally high level of biological diversity and endemic and is recognized as one of the world's eight 'hottest spots' of biological diversity. The documentary reveals the reasons behind the evolution of these species in he Western Ghats and the magnificent orchestration of nature which has allowed this extraordinary habitat to develop and thrive.






